Research identifies that students from equity groups are more likely to drop out of university than their peers. Low-SES students make up 17.1% of all enrolments and have a dropout rate of 31.1%. Students who are part of more than one 'at risk' group are even more likely not to complete their studies (Edwards & McMillan, 2017).
